Parents,

Today's lesson is about how singing can be a form of prayer. If you have musical instruments at home that the kids can play with while singing, get them out. Or you can make shakers by taking a paper plate, fold in half and staple closed, leaving a small space, add dried beans or something that will make a noise when shaken, and then finish closing it up. Let the kids use this while watching the videos. Here are a couple of YouTube music videos you can play for your child/children. The first one is 40 minutes and has multiple songs. Some are for younger kids and some for elementary age. The others are just a single song with motions.
